
Winter Cancellation Information

This year our dance weekend was scheduled for the same weekend as the Zombie Convention, which took place near our hotel at the Asbury Park Convention Center on the Boardwalk. The highlight of this "Undead Festival" is the Zombie Walk, which took place on Saturday afternoon. These are some photos that I took of the bloody creatures:

This was quite a horrific gathering.





I did make it, finally, to the Art Institute, where I spent an awe-struck afternoon which convinced me that I need to go back again and again. What a treasure that place is!
