

We look forward to welcoming over 100 dancers from across the country to our first fly-in in two years, since we took last year off to host the wildly successful convention Chi-Town Shakedown in July.



So what can you do now in preparation of the grand event? Many things! First off, registration is open. So grab a form at the church and send it in; the earlier the better, as it helps the committee better plan scheduling. You can also download a form at the Chi-Town Squares web site, and even pay by PayPal through Club Express (there is a link to the IAGSDC site where you will have to log in to be able to do this.) The current full weekend fee is only \$90,

but will be going up to \$105 on August 1.

Our crack committee, headed up by Andrew Mondt and Michael Pemberton, has made sure all the important details are set. Our own Saundra Bryant and Nick Martellacci from New York are the featured callers, who will be supported by many of our wonderful club and out of town callers. The venue contract has been signed, as we will return to dance at the Center on Halsted Friday through Sunday, in the heart of gay Lakeview, with its myriad of fantastic restaurants and clubs nearby.

Our traditional Sunday brunch, included in the registration fee, will be held at Sidetrack, the Video Bar. It will be a catered event with a cash bar open for alcoholic drinks. Thanks go to honorary member and co-owner of Sidetrack Chuck Hyde for helping arrange this, and for his continued generous support of our club. On Monday we will be back at Ebenezer Lutheran Church, for our customary potluck luncheon and dancing to John Oldfield Finally, you could help by volunteering. It is not too late and Kris Jensen.

The theme of "Finally Legal" began with it being our 21<sup>st</sup> fly-in, the legal drinking age. But with the passage in Illinois of civil unions earlier this year, we have expanded it to a theme suitable for commitment ceremonies and the like. Therefore the Saturday Night dance has been declared the "Wedding Dance", and is sure to be the highlight of the weekend. Feel free to dress in the wedding role of your choice: bride, groom, couple, flower girl, best man, mother of the bride...let your imagination go wild! Maybe watching William and Kate's recent nuptials gave you some ideas... I saw some unique hats there that I may try to imitate!

Another thing you can do is talk it up! Whether you are traveling to local area dances, other fly-ins or the Convention in Atlanta, word of mouth is always the best publicity, and we sure can use it. Be sure to ask a committee member for a handful of registrations forms to bring wherever you go, or print some off yourself.

Another selling point is to wear the new Crossfire T-shirt to out-of-town events. 

Please consider supporting our new class by attending the final regularly-scheduled Plus class on May 19, and the summer classes beginning on May 26.

### Summer Sessions—A Cheap Way to Tune Up Your Rusty Plus!

Hey, did you know that you can get a review of some of those Plus calls you might be a little rusty at, for the low, low, angel rate of \$4\* per session? What a bargain! \*The rate for angels who are members remains \$4. Non-members pay \$8.

During the summer season, the students will learn the following calls, as well as dancing the rest of the Plus level: Relay the Duecey, Peel the Top, Diamonds, Single Circle to a Wave, Trade the Wave, Crossfire, All 8 Spin the Top, Chase Right, Dixie Grand, and Spin Chain and Exchange the Gears. But you can think of it as a detailed review of those tricky calls!

Our final regularly-scheduled Plus class on May 19 will have the normal schedule: Review starts at 7 pm, Regular class starts at 7:30 pm.

We then go on the Summer Schedule, where Regular Class starts at 7:30 pm Thursdays. Summer sessions will be downstairs in the air-conditioned hall. Please see page 6 for the summer schedule.

Our students will graduate Plus and have a ceremony at Crossfire over the Labor Day weekend.
