



Grand Rapids Fly-in Coming Soon on April 13th

Each fly-in is unique to the host club, but basically consists of a weekend of square dancing and special events. Many clubs have their fly-in on the same weekend each year. Chi-Town Squares hosts our annual "Crossfire" fly-in each Labor Day weekend.

The next fly-in within a few hours drive of Chicago is check out their website hosted by Grand Rapids, MI Grand River Squares April 13-15, called "Turn Thru the Tulips and Dutch it Up!".






Winter Cancellation Information

Chi-Town Profiles: Ken Jancy

• Chi-Town Square experienced a huge loss last November when Ken Jancy, life partner of President Bob Sundal (a.k.a. our First Lady), passed away. Ken suffered a heart attack on November 1, his 61st birthday, while preparing to go to a Chi-Town by-laws revision meeting. Paramedics were called and worked on him for a half-hour, but he could not be saved.

Ken was a native Chicagoan, growing up on the South side, and went to school at Gage Park High

School and Judson University in Elgin. He eventually opened up his own travel agency, Sky Trails, in Burbank, which he ran for 15 years. After that he worked as a travel agent for AAA until 2002.

Ken met Bob at the Manhandler Saloon in 2001 and became instant friends. Bob had started taking Chi-Town classes in 1999, but had to quit in December because of his busy schedule. But through the encouragement of Manhandler proprietor Jerry Armstrong, long time Chi-Town mem-

ber and benefactor, Bob and Ken went back to start the class together in 2003. Ken at the time was reluctant, claiming the usual excuse of "having two left feet", but he was willing to give it a try for a few weeks.

Well, not only did he get the bug for square dancing, but he also stepped up above and beyond the call of duty by volunteering for the club. In the years that followed Ken would:

- Serve on the board of directors 2005-2007
- Become class coordinator for the class year 2005-2006

- Serve as Crossfire co-chair for three years 2006-2008
- Receive the Yellow Rock award (with Bob) in 2005
- Serve as Chi-Town representative for the Metropolitan Chicago Association of Square Dancers

Ken especially relished the role as MCASD rep that he held for the last four years. Ken would speak often and proudly about Chi-Town, encouraging the other clubs to attend our events (including our convention in 2010), which shows now through our active par-

ticipation in banner stealing and visits. As largest club in the MCASD, people from other clubs would ask Ken what the secret was to our success, as our status over the years went from a "reluctant acceptance" to taking a leadership role within the association.

In 2008 when the travel industry had dried up and the economy was in turmoil, Ken found himself unemployed and at a crossroads. After several years of working short-term jobs and being laid off four

times in five years, Ken was doing some soulsearching. Inspired by the energy of Barack Obama's election campaign, Ken began to rethink his life and career choices, and started to focus on being happy, not just a big paycheck.

Through fate and the kindness of strangers (as he wrote for an article in *Spread & Circulate* in March 2009), Ken found a meaningful position in 2008 as Donations Manager for Howard Brown's Brown Elephant stores. For the first time he was working for a gay organization, where he can be himself, and felt like he was making a difference.

Long time Chi-Town Squares member and friend Merry Mary (Featherston) passed away on December 30. Mary joined Chi-Town Squares in 1990, the third year of our existence, and received her 20 year medallion at our graduation ceremonies in 2010. Unknown to many, Mary did go through the lessons several times and was a Plus level dancer. In recent years however, she served the club as cashier when we had the class on Tuesday (because the Thursday class of course conflicted with her regular happy hour at the Cell Block!) She would occasionally fill in a square when needed.

As cashier, she was a taskmaster! She would not be too happy if you didn't come with exact change, and God forbid if you didn't sign in the proper way. But we certainly appreciated her accuracy, dependability and warm sense of humor. Even during our last Crossfire event in September, she happily filled in a volunteer slot of watching the rooms while the rest of us were on dinner break.

Mary often served as a judge for our Halloween costume contest. She also had us trained to bring in grocery bags for Open Hand, and more recently, made appeals to bring in unused hotel soaps and toiletries.

Mary was honored Chi-Town Squares in 1999 with a plaque of appreciation, in addition in her numerous other accolades. And we will honor her again in July 2012 when her club badge in placed on the memorial panel at the International Association of Square Dance Club's annual convention in Vancouver. Goodbye Mary!

Despite the troubles Howard Brown has had that remain to this day, Ken found his job there the most the rewarding of any he had.

On December 7, 2011, a memorial was held at Scot's bar at 1829 W Montrose. Over 100 people were there to share their memories of Ken, including square dancers, people from Howard Brown, friends from the bar and many other acquaintances. Bob said another 50 people also expressed their regrets that they couldn't attend. It was a celebration of life that was low key, with some stories being shared for a short time, a memory book for people to write their thoughts, plenty of food and drink, and a final toast and farewell to a dear friend. Ken's other interests besides square dancing included model railroading and antiques. Bob recalls fondly about how Ken was not only his partner, but also his best friend. He said that in the ten years they were together they only had one brief fight, and that was about Chi-Town Squares! He also says that he misses Ken the most on Wednesdays. With Bob's commitment to the club on most Mondays and Thursdays, and working at Scot's other days, Wednesday was "their" day that they usually would go out for dinner or drinks, and talk for hours.

As is tradition, we will honor Ken by affixing his badge (including his "First Lady" badge) to the memorial panel at the next IAGSDC convention, which will be Vancouver in July. Bob was concerned he would not be able to attend due the cost. But through the efforts of Nancy Vedder, a companion flight offered by Gloria Maile and donations by many other Chi-Town members, we were able to raise enough funds to make sure he will be there. Nancy made this announcement at the holiday dance in December, to a surprised and appreciative Bob. It truly shows how our Chi-Town family supports their own in time of need.
