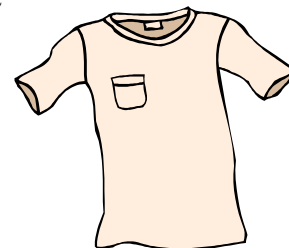

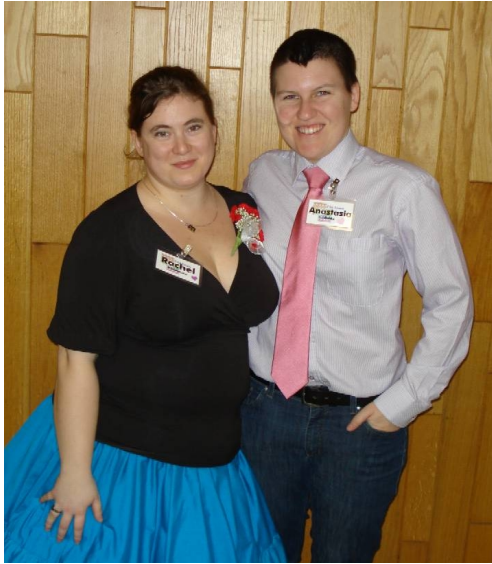

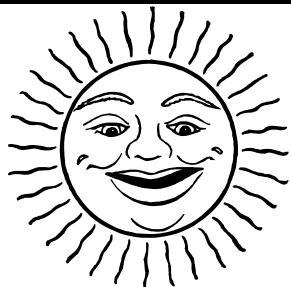

In addition to five premiere roller coasters, they have their own Serengeti Plain with free roaming animals, safari rides, and many shows and restaurants. 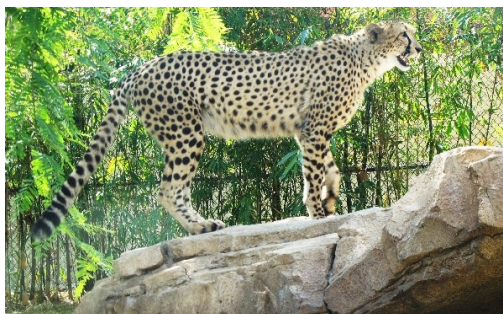

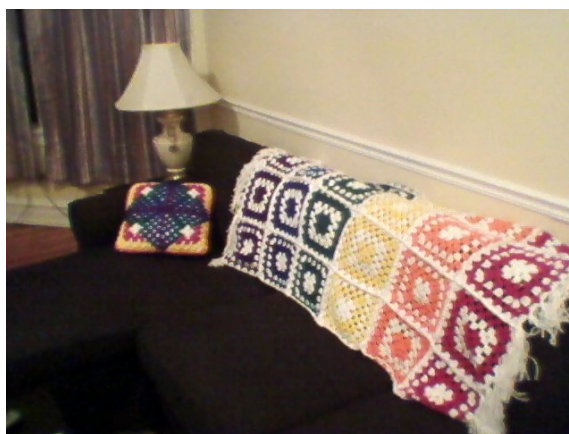
