Letter from the President: Coming This Fall

The weather has cooled off a bit, and autumn has definitely arrived. With the change of season, Chi-Town Squares is also about to gear up for two new ventures.

First up, Crossfire will be held on a new weekend, beginning on Thursday, September 26 with a Contra Dance, called by Kris Jensen. Look for more information inside this issue.

Then on October 11, get ready for our first ever BLAST, an accelerated teaching weekend to be called by Dayle Hodge. If you have not heard, we secured a \$1,500 grant from All Join Hands to pay for the BLAST. This enabled us to only charge new students \$25 for the entire weekend (four sessions), while all angels are free. So spread the word to your family and friends to take advantage of this opportunity. Thanks to the All Join Hands committee.

In addition, our weekly events have commenced. The popular Monday night A/C workshop began on Monday September 9 with Sandie, and will continue Monday night, 7:30-10:00 .

We also began a new Wednesday night C2 class on September 11, taught by John Oldfield. We can still use a few more students (and angels) to keep the class going, so take advantage of this rare opportunity if you feel ready.

Finally, our new Thursday night Plus workshop began on September 12 with Michael. This workshop will rotate our club callers, Michael, John, Arlene, and Sandie. In addition, Therron will call one tip each week. Beginning in November, we will skip the workshop on the first Thursday of the month, so people can support the Queer Contra dance in Logan Square.

Please support this new venture, as it is now the only opportunity to dance Plus regularly, without having the weekly classes. After the Blast, it will expand to a Mainstream and Plus workshop, to give our new dancers a venue to hone their skills.

Looking ahead, we also have our first Club Dance on October 26 with Chuck Witt, our Halloween Dance on Thursday October 31 with Sandie, our Thanksgiving Dance on Saturday November 16 with Aaron Wells, and our Holiday Dance Sunday December 15 with Sandie.

Our Board of Directors has been working hard behind the scenes to keep the club running, especially with all the new events we are trying this season. The next board meeting is scheduled for 5 PM October 26 at the church, before the dance. Members are welcome to attend.

Over the summer, several Chi-Town Squares members went to our annual International Gay Square Dance convention in San Francisco. I personally had a marvelous time. The hotel was great, the city is great, and the callers were great. It was a GREAT time! And we sent Therron to caller school. By the way, I want to thank Therron for filling in at the last minute for our last summer dance. He did a wonderful job!

Fall Into Crossfire Is Here!

Crossfire 2013 is just around the corner! The Crossfire committee, co chaired by Curtis McMillan and myself, has been feverishly planning a fantastic weekend. We have great callers lined up... our own Sandie Bryant, along with Kris Jensen from Albuquerque, are our featured callers. In addition, many of our club callers are also on the schedule.

We are excited about this year's Crossfire being held at our home Ebenezer Lutheran Church, 1650 W. Foster Avenue in the Andersonville neighborhood. Street parking is free around the church and on nearby side streets as well. It is just a few blocks west of Clark Street on Foster. Public buses are available on Clark as well as on Foster. The Red line is 9 blocks to the East. The closest station is located at Berwyn.

Andersonville is full of great places for dining as well as fun eclectic stores. During the break on Saturday it will be easy to find things to do and places to enjoy dinner. There will be a binder at the church with many of Andersonville restaurant menus available for you to look at.

The dates for Crossfire 2013 are September 27-29. In addition there will be a Queer Contra dance held at the church on Thursday the 26th. This dance will be called by Kris Jensen and feature a live music band.

The Contra dance is not included in the admission fee for Crossfire. They request a donation on a sliding scale between \$1.00 and \$10.00. If you have not tried Contra, don't worry; it is fun and not at all hard to learn. No prior Contra dance experience is needed. Learn as you go! For square dancers, the calls will be familiar for the most part. Give it a try, it is really fun!



The Contra dance will begin at 6:30 PM on Thursday, with a short half hour lesson, followed by dancing in earnest 7:00–9:30 PM.

Registration for Crossfire will begin at 6:00 PM Friday at the church, with dancing 7:00–10:30 PM. Heavy hors d'oeuvres will be served Friday night, presented as a potluck by Chitown members.

There will be two Saturday sessions, beginning at 12

noon to 4:00 PM, followed by a dinner break on your own. The evening session for Saturday will be held 7:00–10:30 PM.

The theme for Saturday night is “The Autumn Dance” Dress in autumn colors, or come up with your own fun ideas to go along with the theme!

On Sunday, brunch will be served at Sidetrack in Boystown, 3349 N Halsted St. Brunch begins at 11:00 AM and ends at 12:30 PM. Then we head back to Ebenezer Church for the final Sunday session, 1:30-4:00 PM.

There is still time to register, by going to www.iagsdc.com/chitownsquares, or contacting Curtis at curtismcmillen@gmail.com or 773-888-3019. You can also register at the door. Registration fees are now at \$100.00. Single sessions will be offered for \$15.00 per session per person. We are also still looking for volunteers and contributions for the Friday potluck. Please plan to attend! This is our first Crossfire away from the Center on Halsted in some years. We hope our new venue is successful and we need your help to make it work. Hope to see a big turnout!

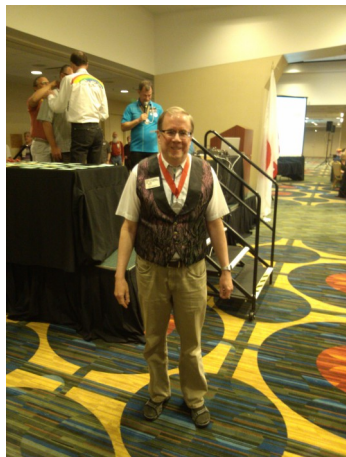

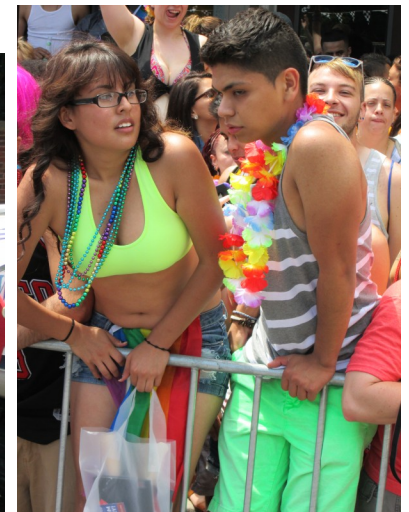

AACE in Indianapolis Comes Up Spades

After a good experience in 2012, AACE (the Academy for Advanced and Challenge Enthusiasts) returned to Indianapolis this year. The host hotel has plenty of parking and is close to the airport, and nearby highways provide easy access to downtown and the suburbs.

Experiences last year gave us hints of things to watch out for this year. My roommate couldn't check in last year because the hotel didn't find his name on the reservation—this year I reminded their reservation desk three times, and check-in went smoothly. The hotel-room key cards tend to stop working after a day or two—this year we went to the front desk together to get new cards at the same time. The on-line maps get confused by the streets around the hotel—this year we knew more than the map programs and saved ourselves some bizarre detours.

The hotel did a good job of cooling the dance halls and supplying water. All the dance halls had low-pile carpeting, something you can plan for (and there isn't much twirling, another difference from an IAGSDC event).

After the trail-in dance on Wednesday evening, there are 3 dance sessions each day - morning, afternoon and evening. Several hundred people attend AACE; it's smaller than the IAGSDC convention, so it's easier to coordinate with people in between dance sessions, say going out for a meal together. I saw many friends from IAGSDC clubs at AACE, and more Chi-Towners than I expected—a very pleasant surprise.

The "Academy" part of the AACE name refers to morning sessions that focus on a call or concept and try to improve dancers' understanding of it. I like this idea very much. But this year it didn't work as well for me as it might: The morning sessions are 2 hours long, so there were 2 different callers for the workshops. One caller would present information about a call or concept and then use it; the next caller couldn't be sure what the first caller had covered, and there were sometimes gaps between the first caller's basic uses and the second caller's fancy complications.

The AACE calling staff is all top-notch callers. Each year the staff invites a few other callers to come to AACE and call, and strut their stuff. Over the years AACE dancers have been introduced to many great callers this way—this year's invited callers included Dayle Hodge, whom many Chi-Towners already know and love.

Last year we found some good places to eat in Indianapolis. We didn't repeat all our successes, but experimented with new places. The City Café made delicious brunches (I've never tasted shagbark hickory syrup before), Grindstone Charley's had decent food at good prices. We already knew that we'd eat well at Shapiro's Deli, Culver's and Skyline Chili.

AACE will be in Indianapolis again next year, June 18 to 21, 2014. You can view <http://www.ceder.net/aace.php4> for more details.

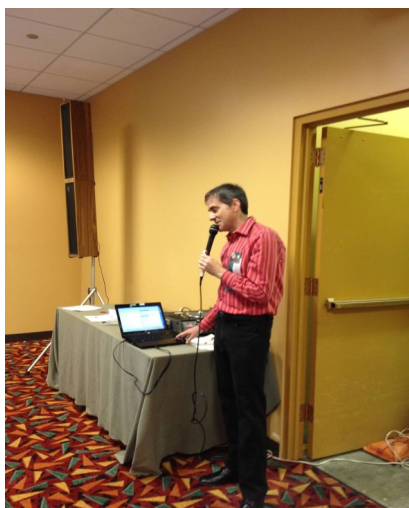
