Free MCASD Student Dance April 6!

Chi-Town Squares will be hosting a special "New Dancer" dance next weekend, and you are invited to come by for FREE!

The Metropolitan Chicago Association of Square Dancers plans four "New Dancer Dances" each year for the promotion and enjoyment of square dancing. On Sunday **April 6**, Chi-Town Squares will serve as the host for the fourth and final one of the season. It will be held 2:00-5:00 PM at Ebenezer Lutheran Church, and John Oldfield will be calling. Come out and enjoy this dance with other new Chicago area dancers, as planned for your pleasure.

There will be no significant teaching or workshops. These sessions are considered to be Dances. The caller will call to the average level of the students on the floor. Dancing time and fun are the only goals. All new dancers and angels are welcome to come and dance.

There will be angels available to dance with the solo. Host club members and angels from other clubs may wear their club badges. It is recommended that square dance apparel be worn, but it is not a requirement. There will be at least one angel tip at all dances.

Admission: \$5.00 per person, all Angels except host club pay. That means Chi-Town members are admitted for FREE! The MCASD will be collecting the money. However we have been asked to bring treats and refreshments and show our unique hospitality! I think we can handle that!

Chi-Town Squares Annual Meeting is May 3

Let this serve as official notice that Chi-Town Squares' Annual Meeting, as prescribed by the club's by-laws, will be held on Saturday May 3 at Ebenezer Lutheran Church. We will start the festivities with a potluck dinner beginning at 5:00 PM, followed by the annual meeting, "fun and games", and all-level dancing. All events are free of charge for members and guests, although only paid members can vote in the Board elections.

This year will be a first in that we technically do not have a graduating class. But those who have finished the Plus program during the Thursday night workshops will be recognized. Generally this is one of the few

events where we dress in our club uniform of black slacks, button shirts, brocade vests and bolo ties. So feel free to dress up if you have the druthers. If you are coming for the potluck, please bring a dish, side, or dessert to contribute.

After dinner (around 6 PM), president Joe Kerouac will preside over the annual meeting. Generally on the agenda is a president's report, reviewing the past season and previewing the next, a treasurer's report, a Crossfire report, and an opportunity for open forum discussion. In addition, various awards are

given, including milestone memberships and the prestigious Yellow Rock award, to be handed out by last year's recipient Kate Reed.

But most important, we will hold elections for four open board positions. Rob Sierzega and Joe Kerouac have announced their intention to run for another term, while Rich Swanson and Sehnert have decided to step down after completing their two-year terms. That means we need at least two new people to step forward. So if you wish to run and have a direct say in the club's future, please let Joe know ASAP so you can be placed on the ballot.

Generally candidates will make a short statement before the election commences. The board then meets once a month thereafter. Being a board member can be a very rewarding experience, so please consider doing so if you have the desire.

After the gavel drops on the meeting, any graduation exercises and recognitions will take place. We will officially welcome our newest members with dancing to club callers and the cutting of cake, and wind down Chi-Town Squares 27th year by around 9:00 PM.

Chi-Town Squares' annual Crossfire fly-in will be held on Columbus Day weekend **October 10-12, 2014**. This year the theme is "Step and Slide Down the Aisle", celebrating the legalization of same sex marriage in Illinois. We plan to decorate the hall in a wedding theme, and will feature a Wedding Dance on Saturday night.

"Step and Slide" is an Advanced level square dance call, with a wedding related styling shout out. So we are asking our callers to teach this call at upcoming workshops so everyone can join in the fun.

So, what is a fly-in? New members may not know, so here is a brief explanation. Each year we hold an event

that spans an entire weekend. There are three days of dancing and socializing, as well as a potluck and a catered brunch. Most of our club members attend, and we also usually have many out-of-towners visit as well.

Many of the gay square dance clubs around the country host a fly-in each year, which our club members travel to all over the continent. Lasting friendships have been formed at these events. Each club's fly-in is unique and differs in many ways from club to club.

We have named our fly-in the "Great Chicago Crossfire", and choose a new theme each year to make the event fun and a little different. Program levels from Mainstream through Challenge are offered as we enjoy dancing to our featured callers as well as our club callers and others from outside clubs. This year, Saundra Bryant and Michael Kellogg will headline Crossfire 2014.

We are currently in the planning stages and have held three meetings so far. Meetings are held monthly and we have a committee that is willing and able to tackle the challenge of putting on such an event. We still welcome all interested members who may have fresh ideas to join the committee. The next meeting will be on **April 23**, 7:00 PM at the home of Jeff Hutchins and David Stewart. Jeff is this year's Chairman, and David, being dragged in by association, is helping as well!

Jean Shamo is this year's Co-Chair, and will be Chair of

Crossfire 2015, with the task of finding a new co-chair, which provides continuity from year to year.

Like last year, we are holding our fly-in at Ebenezer Church in Andersonville. This is a recent change. We have moved from the Center on Halsted, and the Church worked very well for us last year. We will have dancing in two halls. A potluck will be held on Friday evening. On Saturday, there will be two sessions of dancing with lunch and dinner on your own. Snacks will be provided on Saturday. Sunday morning we will enjoy a catered brunch.

The committee is still in process of planning the brunch

and its location. We will be staying local in Andersonville and will not be traveling to Boystown for the brunch. More information will be provided on that later as decisions are made. The last session of dancing will be right after the brunch on Sunday afternoon.

But you can register for Crossfire now! Go to *iagsdc.org* and look for the Events calendar for our event.

Once you create an IAGSDC profile, you can register and pay for Crossfire online. Current price is \$75.00 but will go up to \$90.00 after **May 15**. So register now and save! Admission will be \$100.00 after September 1 or at the door.

All this information will soon be updated at our club website as well. Plus certainly feel free to bring extra flyers and talk up Crossfire at other fly-ins you may attend, as well as at Convention in Salt Lake City.
