### Memories of Pat Kurauski By Bob Siegel and Bee Jay Douglas

On July 13 we lost beloved long-time Chi-Town member Pat Kurauski. Many of us had just seen Pat the St. Louis convention in May, where she danced and had a great time as best she could, despite battling cancer for the past two years. Her best friend Bee Jay, who considered Pat the sister she never had, recently shared some memories about her dear friend.

Pat was a life-long Chicagoan, born and raised on the South side. Though she never married, she was extremely close to her family, especially her brother, his wife, and her many nieces and nephews, who called her Aunt Patsy. She would spend the holidays with them, and plan trips over a vear in advance to travel with them. She enjoyed a long career at St. Paul Federal Bank as a computer programmer. After that she worked at CPS at Lincoln Park High School in their computer labs.

Bee Jay first met Pat in the early 90's at a volleyball league, which played at St. Vincent de Paul Settlement House on Halsted

Street.
