Annual Dinner Meeting & Dance Set for May 14

Let this serve as official notice that Chi-Town Squares' Annual Meeting & Elections, as prescribed by the club's by-laws, will be held on Saturday May 14 at Ebenezer Lutheran Church. We will start the festivities with a potluck dinner beginning at 6:00 PM, followed by the annual meeting, and all-level dancing. All events are free of charge for members and guests, although only paid members as of March 1, 2016 can vote in the Board elections. Generally this is one of the few events where we dress in our club uniform of black slacks, button shirts, brocade vests and bolo ties. So feel free to dress up if you have the druthers.

If you are coming for the potluck, please bring a dish, side, or dessert to contribute, We love some folks to help set up at 5:15pm. After dinner (around 7 PM), president Rob Sierzega will preside over the annual meeting. Generally on the agenda is a president's report, reviewing the past season and previewing the next, a treasurer's report, a Crossfire report, and an opportunity for open forum discussion. In addition, various awards are given, including milestone memberships and the prestigious Yellow Rock award, to be handed out by last year's recipients Jim Cosenza and Rich Jentzen.

But most important, we will hold elections for one one-year term and three full two-year term board positions. Current board member & new treasurer John Wood, is in the middle of his term. Chuck Pease is stepping down with Rob Sierzega running to finish out the last year of Chuck's term. Jim Cosenza, and Joe Kerouac are up re-election and have announced their intent to run. Jeff Hutchins has agreed to run for the third Board position. That means we technically do not need any new candidates. But of course any paid member is eligible to run for a board position. If you wish to run, please let a board member know by May 5 so you can be placed on the ballot. Generally candidates will make a short statement before the election commences. The board then meets once a month thereafter.

After the gavel drops on the meeting, we will celebrate by dancing to our favorite club callers. On May 14 we also will have the option to renew your Chi-Town membership for next season via cash, check or PayPal, and new members can sign up, too. So be sure to bring your checkbook or credit card! We will wind down Chi-Town Squares 29th year by around 10:00 PM.

Norm Cratty, Parish Administrator, has graciously cleared the church's calendar to allow us use of the church that weekend.


Registration forms are available online at www.iagsdc.org/event or at weekly workshop and dances.

2016 Summer Happenings

With the May annual meeting close upon us, it will soon be time for Chi-Town to switch to our summer schedule, when we generally dance each program twice a month. Our final weekly sessions will be **Monday**May 16 for the A/C workshop, and Thursday May
19 for the Mainstream/Plus workshop.

Then beginning on **June 2** and through August, all Chi-Town dances are scheduled in the air-conditioned dining room, and will only be two hours long.

In summer we have seven Mondays and nine Thursdays scheduled. The Mondays will continue with C1 lessons at the start, until the teach list is completed. Thursdays will be alternating Mainstream and Plus, except for the First Thursday No Experience Necessary sessions on June 2, July 7 and August 4.

In addition, we have our annual Pride Dance coming up on **Saturday June 11, 7-10 PM** with Nick Martellacci from New York. Then on **August 27**, we are hosting a 'Rusty PLUS' afternoon workshop from 1 to 5 PM, with a dinner break and then a strictly PLUS dance from 7 to 9 PM; all in the air-conditioned Dining room downstairs. 


